

Children in Need Day- Odd Socks Monday/Superheroes



We will be celebrating Children in Need Day on Friday November 17. It will be a non-uniform/wear spotty clothing / dress as a superhero day if you wish day. We will be making a collection to raise funds for Children in Need.

In our two-year-old classroom children and staff will be wearing something yellow or spotty, taking part in Pudsey yoga and making spotacular Pudsey biscuits

Reception children will be surrounded by colour. They will use playdough to roll coloured dots and will make Pudsey models. The children will decorate a cake with a spotty theme and will have a go at applying their number skills to a dot-to-dot.

As part of Anti-Bullying Week, Reception children will wear odd socks and will talk in circle time about how different our socks are, and how different we all are. They will learn that it is good to celebrate each other and that we should help "fill each other's buckets".

Year 1 and Year 2 children will be wearing odd socks on Monday 13th November to celebrate what makes us all unique in Anti-Bullying Week! They will design a pair of odd socks, join in with the anti-bullying rap and create a poster to raise awareness.

Year 1 and 2 children will take part in many 'Spotacular' activities to raise awareness of this year's Children in Need. They will take part in a 'bear-pee' challenge, a spotty treasure hunt, spotty art and listen to the poem 'Spots' by Diane Alber.

The children in Years 3 and 4 will be participating in a range of activities that will help them understand the important messages of Children in Need whilst developing their awareness of bullying. The children will design a superhero, with carefully selected features, that could help 'stamp out' bullying. During the day, the children will also participate in a range of activities that promote positive mental health such as happy breathing, exercise and acts of kindness.

Year 5 and 6 will be combining their anti-bullying week theme of Make Some Noise with Children In Need. The pupils will take part in a selection of lessons culminating with the production of a Super Hero comic strip which depicts a hero helping a needy child.
