
experience. To top it all off, Class 6S's pupils were also able to serve the Year 2 children with juice and biscuits which made everyone smile.

World Book Day



Children in our Nursery 2 class were inspired by the book The Dot written by Peter H Reynolds. They created their own dot inspired paintings using sponge printing, dot drawings in pastels and colourful dotty pompom collages to celebrate this inspiring book that shows there is a creative spirit in all of us.

Our reception children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the story of Little Red Riding Hood. They solved problems, measures basket items and asked some very demanding and perceptive questions to the wolf. We think the puppet show was the highlight of the day.

Key Stage 1 children enjoyed following Shapeless Lee on his journeys. They wrote super character descriptions about how he felt useless and totally deflated because he didn't fit with anyone or anything. Then he met Sun, who encouraged Shapeless Lee to follow him for the day, to see what or who he might find. The children wrote excellent conversations between the two characters and enjoyed acting them out. They were thrilled when we reached the end of the story and Shapeless Lee found another shape just like him. Together, they fitted perfectly in the shape of a love heart. To finish our World Book Day celebrations, the children solved tangram puzzles by putting the shapes together to make their very own shape. They thoroughly enjoyed the story.

Children in Years 3 and 4 participated in a wealth of activities to celebrate World Book Day! They wrote a repetitive poem from the perspective of The Tear Thief, after reading the book of the same name by Carol Ann Duffy; created beautiful bookmarks and listened to audiobooks about the Ancient Egyptians. Later, the children found their Zen with some 'Bubble Mindfulness' and revisited The Tear Thief to inspire their emotion-themed artwork. They ended the day relaxed to the max as they curled up with a good book, a hot chocolate and some biscuits.

The children in Year 5 & 6 took part in a variety of activities for World Book Day. The year groups were introduced to the book 'The Tear Thief' which is a book about a fairy who travels around searching for upset children to steal their tears away. Our children wrote excellent continuations of the story which involved creating a reason for a child to be upset and then showed how after the tears had gone, the child felt much better. Once the children had written their own adaptations, they then painted a background in the style of the book and wrote their own version on it. The children produced some beautiful work.
