British Science Week



This week, our school transformed into a hub of discovery as students across all year groups took part in a thrilling Science Week, filled with hands-on experiments and mind-blowing investigations! One of the standout activities was creating edible water bottles using a type of seaweed—an exciting exploration of sustainable packaging that had students fascinated by the potential of science in reducing plastic waste. Meanwhile, budding chemists dived into polymer science, testing the impacts of cross-linkers and discovering how custard, when handled correctly, can bounce like a rubber ball! Elsewhere, students experimented with bubble science to craft incredible bubble snakes that stretched far beyond expectations, while others explored the magic of liquid density by making homemade lava lamps with mesmerising blobs that moved in vibrant colours.
